BAPS: substance (1)

- endorsed at the High Level Forum-4 of effective development cooperation December 2012
- to draw on synergies with the wider development agenda
- 3 principal objectives:
 - Fully integrate statistics in decision making
 - Promote open access to statistics
 - Increase resources for statistics



BAPS: substance (2)

- 5 Actions:

1. Improving statistical systems
2. Public access to data
3. Effective use of data for development
4. Track outcome of global summits
5. Robust financing for statistics



BAPS: TT process

- Terms of References agreed June 2012
- Exchanges on Progress with ExCom in October 2012 and February 2013
- Priorities and mapping against the 5 actions
- Gaps and proposal of activities to fill those gaps
- Proposal and ongoing discussion on logical framework to monitor



BAPS: TT outcome (1)

- Identification of possible activities to take on board (see report)
 - User-producer dialogues
 - Technology innovations
 - Big data
 - Post-2015 activities
- Proposal on the role of the secretariat (from CANK to SAMS) absorbing the new BAPS elements.
- SAMS is also a fund raising and coordination tool: shows that PARIS21 adapts to new realities and aligns with the development effectiveness agenda.



BAPS: TT outcome (2)

- A yet to finalise logframe monitored by the secretariat:
 - Light and simple
 - Measures our collective effort for statistics (donors and partner countries)
 - Not too costly and burdensome for partners and secretariat to get it measured
 - Progress becomes clear over time
 - Link to the monitoring of the Global Partnership commitments which will be reported on at the Ministerial end 2013
