The first UN World Data Forum, held in Cape Town earlier this year, saw a total of nine sessions which focused on the thematic area of “New approaches to capacity development for better data.” While the capacity of national data ecosystems appears high on the global agenda, it is also a call for all actors to rethink their current approaches to capacity development. This seminar will build on the outcomes of the Cape Town Forum and explore how national data ecosystems can be supported to make full use of the development data revolution. This will require new approaches that go beyond the traditional supply-side interventions and work at strengthening data use, literacy and results.
